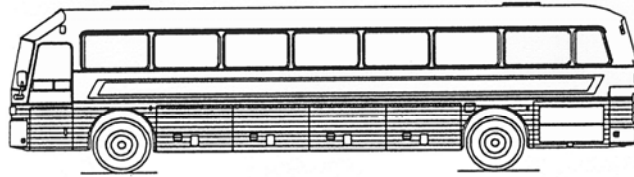

His knowledge about the Eagle bus was endless. Many of us have inquired of Wayne regarding a problem or a needed part for our buses. He always helped.

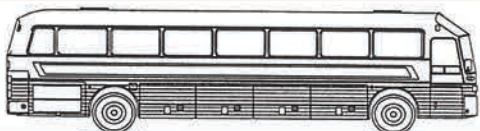

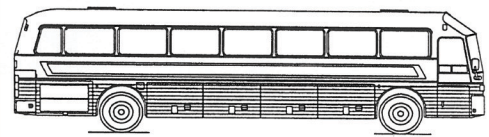
San Angelo 2021

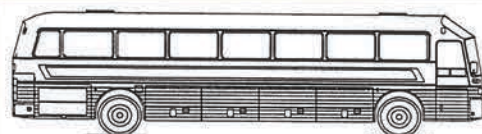
The evenings brought a cool breeze and we opened our bus windows for a great nights sleep.
